Stewardship Committee Report [Aaron]

-Tree maintenance /replacement and the addition of a bench are planned for this spring, per previouslyannounced decision for use of funds received from the estate of Chris P.

-The cherry tree and the ash tree are both dying. Plan is to replace the cherry tree first and hold off on the ash as long as possible.

Education Ministry Report [Ron]

-Upcoming Adult Hour: "Getting to Know You" for one Sunday, no Adult Hour on Easter, then studying "The Upside-Down Kingdom" for the remainder of the school year.

Worship Ministry Report [Gail]

-The committee has developed a new "Worship Planning Guide" to assist those preparing to lead worship. This will be available on the "members" section of our website and copies are also available in the worship sign-up book.

-The committee is hoping to encourage people who have not previously led worship to give it a try.

VISION STATEMENT DISCERNMENT PROCESS [Terry Zehr]

-Terry facilitated a small group reflection around developing a Vision Statement for our fellowship. We started our small group discussion by considering the Strengths and Challenges of our Fellowship discussed at the last meeting [See Attached].

-Asked to draw a picture of our Vision, each small group independently drew a variety of a TREE to illustrate our vision, and each group shared their comments:

-Reaching out, deepening our roots

-Welcome, witness, and nurturing faith

-Purposefully accountable community that spreads the love of Christ in the Rochester area

-Rooted, sustainable, stable but changing with the seasons, dormant for half of the year.

-God calls us into a welcoming community for the nurture of our faith in order to offer a witness in the world—to justice, mercy, and peace.

COMMON THEMES: rooted/deepening, reaching out (spreading/fruitful), community (welcoming, nurturing and accountable), shade, inviting, alive, nourishing

Additional Sharing: The relevance of a song we commonly sing about trees (Sing the Story #116), Jesus' comparison of the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed, Jesus' metaphor of vine and branches.

TOP IDEAS: Rooted community, reaching out/fruits/spread, nurturing/welcoming, tree as metaphor

PLAYING WITH THE IDEA OF TREE AS METAPHOR: seasons, healing, shade, stability, fruit, grafting in, supporting other growth, enriching, rooted, inviting, sheltering, growing, life-giving, home for many, welcoming, hope, witness, preventing cultural erosion, nurturing/nourishing, down and up, stability and change, many parts, nesting, climbing, durable, long life, slow metabolism

Conclusion: Terry suggested that the REVIVE team take the reflections shared today and develop a Vision Statement that captures the themes discussed today and post this Vision Statement in a public area for the congregation to reflect on, modify if needed, and ultimately adopt as our own.
