Worship Ministry

We used \$92.00 of our discretional pastoral care money for outsiders to send a young lady home to York Pa after she made a bad decision to move up here and move in with a guy she met on line. He turned out to be very abusive. We had several phone conversations with her and Nancy met with her at the House of Mercy. She was very grateful for the ticket. I talked with her a bit about the value of having a church community for support and told her to look up one of the three Mennonite churches when she returned to York.

Education Ministry

From January 28 – March 4, Gail will lead a series on a book about the Sabbath. On March 11 and 25 we will be doing a "getting to know you" series where people describe their faith stories/life stories. If you are interested in helping us get to know you better, contact Mark.

Finance Ministry Report

Our fiscal year will close on the 31st of January. Jen is busy wrapping up final year-end numbers, generating donation thank you letters, and issuing 1099's for Ephraim & Amy, our two paid contractors. It seems likely that we will have some extra money in our General Fund over our opening balance from the beginning of our fiscal year, but we will not know until we close the year. Year-end numbers and the narrative highlights will be published either as an attachment to midweek announcements or as a separate communication in mid-February.

The Finance Ministry will be meeting in early February once year-end numbers are finalized. If needed, they will make a proposal regarding any excess or deficit funds. This will be shared with the Leadership Team in mid-February and put on the agenda for our next Congregational Meeting.
